The batteries are factory installed in the cabinets and connected by jumpers between the cabinets. Depending on the battery size the cabinets can weigh up to 5000 pounds each.

Minimum clearances must be maintained between the cabinets and surrounding building parts/cabinet to accommodate the installation and maintenance of the base station.

All battery racks and cabinets associated with UPS systems should have NEC code green wire grounds linking all racks, for safety reasons. Periodic inspections should be made of the grounding system to ...
